

Georges River



1. **Captain Cook Bridge**- This bridge was built in 1965 replacing vehicular ferry service which had been operating since 1916.
2. **St George Motor Boat Club**
3. **Tom Ugly's Bridge**- Was built in 1929 replacing a hand operated ferry service.
4. **Bald Face Point Reserve**- The site of a sandstone quarry in the 1920's for the Tom Ugly's Bridge. The 2 concrete blocks were the foundation of the crane used.
5. **Kyle Bay**- Home of the Merriman Estate. Granted in 1853. One of the last original houses on the river. Once owned by Legacy now used as a home for wayward children.
6. **Connells Bay**- Named after Charles O'Connell who purchased 500 acres of land here for 880 pounds in 1857.
7. **Neverfail Bay**- George Bass & Matthew Flinders discovered a reliable fresh water supply here whilst exploring. Hence the name
8. **Gungah Bay**- Home of a bushranger who lived in a cave at the bottom of the bay who used to steal cattle. He was so successful they made a track to his cave.
9. **Jew Fish Bay**- Popular with fishing. Jew fish bay and point are named for the Mulloway also known as Jewfish Bay.
10. **Lime Kiln Bay & Wetlands**
11. **Georges River National Park**
12. **Como Rail Bridge**- One of the first major railway bridges in NSW opened in 1886 and closed in 1970 now its used as a pedestrian and cycle bridge.
13. **Kangaroo Point**- One of the more expensive addresses on the river. Water front houses here sell from \$2.5million up
14. **Nervi**- This house was designed by Nervi. Who was contracted as a consultant for the Opera House after Joern Utzon was sacked. You can see the influence of the sails design
15. **Sylvania Waters**- The largest privately owned waterway in Sydney.

Sans Souci Wharf & Departure Point
